## Lenten Journey with Father Timothy

This Lent, as we walk this path together, I encourage you to keep a Bible close at hand, allowing God's Word to guide your daily reflection through each day's sharing. Let us continue to journey, pray, and grow closer to God—together.

### Second Sunday of Lent: Offering God Our Best - Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18

When God asked Abraham to offer his only son, he responded simply and faithfully: "Here I am." He did not ask "Why?" Instead, he trusted and feared the Lord with a reverent heart. Abraham offered God the best and the only gift he had—his beloved son. Because of this deep faith, God blessed him abundantly. The Lord accepted not so much the external offering, but the inner sacrifice: a faithful heart, obedience, and total trust. So often, we realize that before God we are more a receiver than a giver. May we learn to offer God our best gifts and even our sins to Him with sincere repentance and a contrite heart.

#### Living the Word:

**With oneself:** Offer God your income, talents, children, and time; also offer your sins and unhealthy attachments.

**With others:** Share in their struggles; give thanks to God on their behalf.

**With God:** Thank God each day; learn to say with trust, "Here I am."

**Prayer:** Lord, "Here I am." May this be the response of my heart when You call me from this life. Grant that I may always be ready to answer Your call, at any moment of my life. Amen.

### Monday: Reverencing the Lord - Deuteronomy 9:4b-10

Throughout the Old Testament, the fear of the Lord is mentioned again and again. Scripture reminds us that the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom. Those who are truly wise know how to fear the Lord. This fear is not a fear of punishment, but a deep reverence, respect, and worship of God. God draws close to us like a friend, even like a beloved companion, yet He remains God—holy and sovereign. In today's world, many people are pushing God out of their lives. In the name of freedom—a freedom that God Himself has given—people try to exclude God. Ironically, the more advanced and civilized humanity becomes, the more faith in God seems to fade. The words of Jesus echo strongly in our time: "When the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on earth?" (cf. Luke 18:8). These words seem to be fulfilled before our eyes.

#### Living the Word:

**With oneself:** Learn to fear the Lord in a true and holy way; place God above all else in your life.

**With others:** Help them recognize God's presence in their lives and acknowledge His power.

**With God:** Praise the Lord and honor His divine authority.

**Prayer:** Lord, grant me a true fear of God. Only when reverence for You lives in my heart will I become humble and learn to submit to Your holy will. Amen.

### Tuesday: Actions Must Accompany Words - Matthew 23:1-12

Many of us often fall into a common mistake: we speak but do not act, or we forget to do what we have said. Too often, our faith becomes a "faith of words" rather than a "faith of deeds." Why is this so? God gave us one mouth, but two hands—perhaps to remind us that faith is meant to be lived and practiced more than spoken. From this Gospel passage, we are invited to reflect during this Lenten journey: I do not live only by what I say, but by what I do. This Lent calls us to speak less and do more—better yet, to act first and speak later. Jesus teaches us today: "The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; and whoever humbles himself will be exalted." We are called to be humble disciples, ready to serve one another with love.

#### Living the Word:

**With oneself:** Believe the Word of God and practice what I preach.

**With others:** Proclaim the Gospel through the witness of my life; do for others what I hope they would do for me.

**With God:** Read, believe, and live the Word of God.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, teach me humility, especially when I am entrusted with great responsibilities. Help me to live my faith more through actions than through words. May the Blessed Virgin Mary help me to be humble like her, to open my heart, and to faithfully receive and carry out Your holy will. Amen.

### Wednesday: To Serve, Not to Be Served - Matthew 20:17-28

In the Bible, we repeatedly see Jesus healing others and even washing the feet of His disciples. Jesus Himself is the perfect model of service—not One who seeks to be served, but One who gives Himself completely for others. The life of Saint Mother Teresa beautifully reflects this spirit of service lived by Christ. Her simple and poor way of life reveals the heart of one who gives rather than receives. She is loved throughout the world not because of eloquent words or powerful preaching, but because of her quiet, hidden acts of love. Today, Jesus reminds us of this essential lesson: "Whoever wishes to be first among you shall be your servant." This invites us to examine ourselves honestly: Have we truly committed ourselves to serving others? And when we serve, do we serve with our hearts? Without love, our service becomes merely an obligation rather than a true gift of self.

#### Living the Word:

**With oneself:** Examine whether I am serving or seeking to be served. Have I truly committed myself to service?

**With others:** Serve for the good of their souls, always seeing myself as their servant in Christ.

**With God:** Ask for the grace of humility and a spirit of simple, self-giving service.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, grant me a heart that serves quietly, humbly, and with love. May I fade into the background so that You may shine forth through my acts of service. Help me always to serve in genuine charity and love. Amen.

#### Thursday: The Reward for Those Who Follow the Lord - Luke 16:19–31

The world often relies on clever schemes and dishonest practices to achieve its goals and gain profit. As Christians, however, we strive to live uprightly and truthfully. As followers of Christ, we are not called to build our happiness on this passing world, but to seek the joy of eternal life. If Jesus had not risen from the dead, our faith would be meaningless. And if following Him meant suffering in this life only to suffer again in the next, then our hope would indeed be empty. But God does not promise earthly wealth to those who follow Him; instead, He promises eternal life. Jesus reminds us that no one can serve two masters: we cannot serve both money and God. Christ has already paid the price for our salvation so that we may share in eternal life. What remains for us is to accept this gift and faithfully live in a way that preserves the reward He has promised.

#### Living the Word:

With oneself: Believe and live the Word of God; accept a life rooted in truth and righteousness.

With others: Help the poor and needy; honor and uplift those who are humble and overlooked.

With God: Trust in God's just judgment and give thanks for His loving care for the poor and the little ones.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, what good is it to gain the whole world and lose heaven? My joy and happiness are found in having You with me. I thank You for the promise of eternal life—a gift purchased at the price of Your Precious Blood. Amen.

#### Friday: The Cross and the Holy Cross - Genesis 37:3–4, 12–13a, 17b–28:

In the Old Testament, Joseph, who was betrayed by his own brothers out of jealousy, because their father loved him more. They sold Joseph to traders on their way to Egypt for twenty pieces of silver. In their eyes, Joseph became a burden—a “cross” born of envy. However, God was with Joseph. In time, he rose to become a powerful leader in Pharaoh's court, and through him, the entire family of Jacob was saved from famine and death. In the New Testament, Jesus was sold for thirty pieces of silver. To the Pharisees and scribes, Jesus became a “cross,” an obstacle they wanted to eliminate. We tend to see the cross only as punishment, suffering, or a heavy burden in life. But when we accept the “cross” in faith and are united with Christ, it is no longer a crushing weight on our shoulders, but a path that leads us closer to God and to new life.

#### Living the Word:

With oneself: Accept suffering, difficulties, and disappointments with love, forgiveness, and sacrifice.

With others: Love them even when they are difficult, even when they feel like enemies or burdens.

With God: Give thanks for the Cross of Christ and ask Him to remain with you as you carry your own cross.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, my life, too, has its crosses. Grant that I may accept them with faith, trust, and hope in Your strength, so that I may never carry my cross alone, but always walk with You, who accompany and sustain me. Amen.

#### Saturday: God Casts All My Sins into the Depths of the Sea - Micah 7:14–15, 18–20

There was once a father who became angry with his child for repeatedly ignoring his advice. One day, unable to hold back any longer, he shouted, “Haven't I told you not to do that anymore? Why do you keep doing it?” Immediately after speaking those words, another thought came to his mind—as if God Himself were saying to him: “Haven't I told you not to do that anymore? Why do you keep doing it?” At that moment, the father's anger melted away. Thanks be to God, who forgives all the sins of His people. This is where we often differ from God. When others hurt us, we tend to remember their faults and bring them up again and again. During this Lenten season, we are invited to learn from God: to remove injustice, to forgive every offense, and to let go of resentment instead of holding onto it tightly. The prophet Micah reminds us that God delights in mercy. He does not hold our sins against us, but casts them into the depths of the sea, never to be retrieved again. Such is the love and compassion of our God.

#### Living the Word:

With oneself: Ask God to heal and remove any pain that is still buried in your mind and heart.

With others: Forgive and forget the offenses committed against you.

With God: Ask for God's strength to forgive and to be reconciled.

**Prayer:** Father, grant me the strength to turn away from my sins. Help me also to forgive the faults of others—to forget them and not bring them up again—because You have treated me with the same mercy. Amen.

## Camino Cuaresmal con el Padre Timothy

En esta Cuaresma, mientras recorremos juntos este camino, los invito a mantener la Biblia siempre a mano, permitiendo que la Palabra de Dios guíe su reflexión diaria a través de cada meditación. Ahora, caminemos, oremos y crezcamos en cercanía con Dios—juntos.

### Segundo Domingo de Cuaresma: Ofrecer a Dios lo Mejor - Génesis 22, 1–2. 9a. 10–13. 15–18

Cuando Dios pidió a Abraham que ofreciera a su único hijo, él respondió con sencillez y fidelidad: «Aquí estoy». No preguntó “¿Por qué?”. En cambio, confió y temió al Señor con un corazón reverente. Abraham ofreció a Dios lo mejor y lo único que tenía: a su hijo amado. Por esta fe profunda, Dios lo bendijo abundantemente. El Señor no aceptó tanto la ofrenda exterior cuanto el sacrificio interior: un corazón fiel, la obediencia y la confianza total. Con frecuencia, descubrimos que ante Dios somos más receptores que dadores. Que aprendamos a ofrecer a Dios nuestros mejores dones e incluso nuestros pecados, con un arrepentimiento sincero y un corazón contrito.

#### Vivir la Palabra:

Con uno mismo: Ofrece a Dios tus ingresos, talentos, hijos y tiempo; ofrece también tus pecados y apegos desordenados.

Con los demás: Comparte sus luchas; da gracias a Dios en su nombre.

Con Dios: Agradece a Dios cada día; aprende a decir con confianza: «Aquí estoy».

**Oración:** Señor, «aquí estoy». Que esta sea la respuesta de mi corazón cuando Tú me llames desde esta vida. Concédeme estar siempre dispuesto a responder a tu llamada, en cualquier momento de mi vida. Amén.

### Lunes: Reverenciar al Señor - Deuteronomio 9, 4b–10

A lo largo del Antiguo Testamento, el temor del Señor se menciona una y otra vez. La Escritura nos recuerda que el temor del Señor es el principio de la sabiduría. Los verdaderamente sabios saben cómo temer al Señor. Este temor no es miedo al castigo, sino una profunda reverencia, respeto y adoración a Dios. Dios se acerca a nosotros como un amigo, incluso como un compañero amado, y sin embargo sigue siendo Dios—santo y soberano. En el mundo de hoy, muchas personas están expulsando a Dios de sus vidas. En nombre de la libertad—una libertad que Dios mismo nos ha dado—se intenta excluir a Dios. Irónicamente, cuanto más avanzada y civilizada se vuelve la humanidad, más parece desvanecerse la fe en Dios. Las palabras de Jesús resuenan con fuerza en nuestro tiempo: «Cuando venga el Hijo del Hombre, ¿encontrará fe en la tierra?» (cf. Lc 18, 8). Estas palabras parecen cumplirse ante nuestros ojos.

#### Vivir la Palabra:

Con uno mismo: Aprende a temer al Señor de manera verdadera y santa; coloca a Dios por encima de todo en tu vida.

Con los demás: Ayúdales a reconocer la presencia de Dios en sus vidas y a reconocer su poder.

Con Dios: Alaba al Señor y honra su autoridad divina.

**Oración:** Señor, concédeme un verdadero temor de Dios. Solo cuando la reverencia hacia Ti viva en mi corazón llegaré a ser humilde y aprenderé a someterme a tu santa voluntad. Amén.

### Martes: Las Acciones Deben Acompañar a las Palabras - Mateo 23, 1–12

Muchos de nosotros caemos con frecuencia en un error común: hablamos, pero no actuamos; o olvidamos hacer lo que hemos dicho. Demasiadas veces, nuestra fe se convierte en una “fe de palabras” más que en una “fe de obras”. ¿Por qué sucede esto? Dios nos dio una sola boca, pero dos manos—quizá para recordarnos que la fe está hecha para vivirse y practicarse más que para hablarse. Este pasaje del Evangelio nos invita a reflexionar durante este camino cuaresmal: no vivo solo de lo que digo, sino de lo que hago. Esta Cuaresma nos llama a hablar menos y hacer más—mejor aún, a actuar primero y hablar después. Jesús nos enseña hoy: «El mayor entre ustedes sea su servidor. El que se enaltece será humillado, y el que se humilla será enaltecido». Estamos llamados a ser discípulos humildes, dispuestos a servirnos unos a otros con amor.

#### Vivir la Palabra:

Con uno mismo: Cree en la Palabra de Dios y practica lo que predicas.

Con los demás: Proclama el Evangelio con el testimonio de tu vida; haz por los demás lo que esperas que hagan por ti.

Con Dios: Lee, cree y vive la Palabra de Dios.

**Oración:** Señor Jesús, enséñame la humildad, especialmente cuando se me confían grandes responsabilidades. Ayúdame a vivir mi fe más con acciones que con palabras. Que la Santísima Virgen María me ayude a ser humilde como ella, a abrir mi corazón y a recibir y cumplir fielmente tu santa voluntad. Amén.

### Miércoles: Servir, No Ser Servido - Mateo 20, 17–28

En la Biblia vemos repetidamente a Jesús sanando a los demás e incluso lavando los pies de sus discípulos. Jesús mismo es el modelo perfecto de servicio—no uno que busca ser servido, sino uno que se entrega totalmente por los demás. La vida de Santa Madre Teresa refleja de manera hermosa este espíritu de servicio vivido por Cristo. Su estilo de vida sencillo y pobre revela el corazón de quien da más que recibe. Es amada en todo el mundo no por palabras elocuentes o predicaciones poderosas, sino por sus actos silenciosos y ocultos de amor. Hoy, Jesús nos recuerda esta lección esencial: «El que quiera ser el primero entre ustedes, que sea su servidor». Esto nos invita a examinarnos con honestidad: ¿nos hemos comprometido de verdad a servir a los demás? Y cuando servimos, ¿servimos con el corazón? Sin amor, nuestro servicio se convierte simplemente en una obligación y no en un verdadero don de sí.

#### Vivir la Palabra:

Con uno mismo: Examina si estoy sirviendo o buscando ser servido. ¿Me he comprometido verdaderamente al servicio?

Con los demás: Sirve para el bien de sus almas, viéndome siempre como su servidor en Cristo.

Con Dios: Pide la gracia de la humildad y un espíritu de servicio sencillo y entregado.

**Oración:** Señor Jesús, concédeme un corazón que sirva en silencio, con humildad y con amor. Que yo desaparezca para que Tú brilles a través de mis obras de servicio. Ayúdame a servir siempre con caridad y amor auténticos. Amén.

### Jueves: La Recompensa para Quienes Siguen al Señor - Lucas 16, 19–31

El mundo a menudo se apoya en planes astutos y prácticas deshonestas para alcanzar sus objetivos y obtener ganancias. Como cristianos, en cambio, nos esforzamos por vivir con rectitud y verdad. Como seguidores de Cristo, no estamos llamados a construir nuestra felicidad sobre este mundo pasajero, sino a buscar la alegría de la vida eterna. Si Jesús no hubiera resucitado de entre los muertos, nuestra fe carecería de sentido. Y si seguirlo significara sufrir en esta vida solo para volver a sufrir en la siguiente, entonces nuestra esperanza estaría vacía. Pero Dios no promete riquezas terrenales a quienes lo siguen; promete la vida eterna. Jesús nos recuerda que nadie puede servir a dos señores: no podemos servir al dinero y a Dios al mismo tiempo. Cristo ya ha pagado el precio de nuestra salvación para que podamos participar de la vida eterna. Lo que nos corresponde ahora es aceptar este don y vivir fielmente de un modo que conserve la recompensa que Él nos ha prometido.

#### Vivir la Palabra

Con uno mismo: Cree y vive la Palabra de Dios; acepta una vida enraizada en la verdad y la justicia.

Con los demás: Ayuda a los pobres y necesitados; honra y eleva a los humildes y olvidados.

Con Dios: Confía en el juicio justo de Dios y da gracias por su amoroso cuidado de los pobres y de los pequeños.

**Oración:** Señor Jesús, ¿de qué sirve ganar el mundo entero y perder el cielo? Mi gozo y mi felicidad están en tenerte conmigo. Te doy gracias por la promesa de la vida eterna, un don adquirido al precio de tu Preciosísima Sangre. Amén.

### Viernes: La Cruz y la Santa Cruz - Génesis 37, 3–4. 12–13a. 17b–28

En el Antiguo Testamento, José fue traicionado por sus propios hermanos por envidia, porque su padre lo amaba más. Lo vendieron a unos mercaderes que iban camino de Egipto por veinte monedas de plata. A sus ojos, José se convirtió en una carga, una “cruz” nacida de la envidia. Sin embargo, Dios estaba con José. Con el tiempo, llegó a ser un poderoso gobernante en la corte del faraón y, por medio de él, toda la familia de Jacob fue salvada del hambre y de la muerte. En el Nuevo Testamento, Jesús fue vendido por treinta monedas de plata. Para los fariseos y escribas, Jesús se convirtió en una “cruz”, un obstáculo que querían eliminar. Tendemos a ver la cruz solo como castigo, sufrimiento o una carga pesada en la vida. Pero cuando aceptamos la “cruz” con fe y nos unimos a Cristo, ya no es un peso aplastante sobre nuestros hombros, sino un camino que nos conduce más cerca de Dios y a una vida nueva.

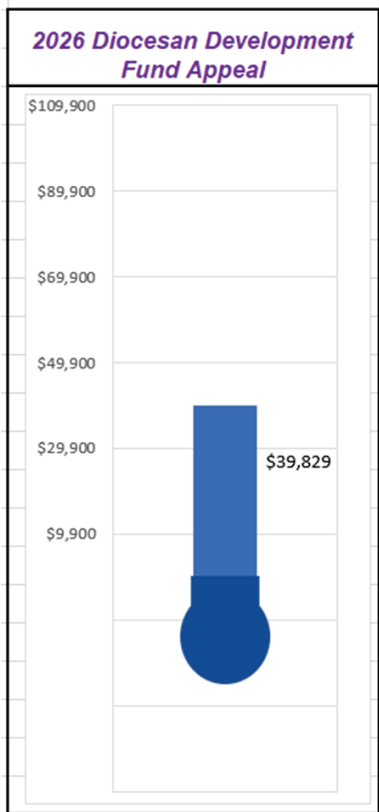

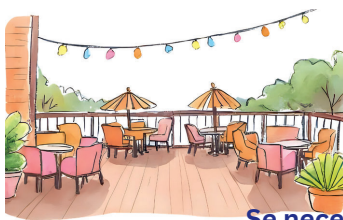
**Volunteers Needed to Help Design Our New Courtyard Patio!**

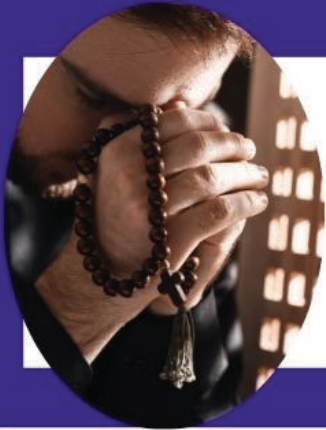

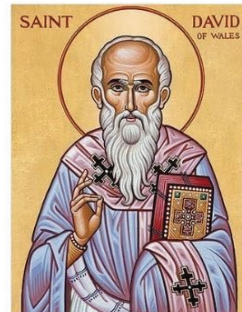
