Lenten Journey with Father Timothy

As we continue to walk this path in our Lenten journey together, I encourage you to keep a Bible close at hand, allowing God's Word to guide your daily reflection through each day's sharing. In reflection and prayer, let us grow closer to God—together.

Third Sunday of Lent: Do Not Let Your Heart Be Empty of God - John 2:13–25

The emptiness of God in our hearts does not necessarily mean that we stop going to Mass, receiving Holy Communion, or going to Confession. God is love. Therefore, whenever we fail to love—when our hearts harbor anger, jealousy, resentment, hatred, or bitterness—our hearts are, in fact, empty of God. Another form of emptiness occurs when we allow a different “master” to take possession of our hearts: money, physical beauty, fame, status, pride, or self-importance. God has spoken clearly: “No one can serve two masters; either he will love one and hate the other.” So how can we know who truly reigns in our hearts? There are signs that help us recognize this. Whatever our thoughts, desires, and longings return to most often—what occupies our mind and energy—that is usually our true master. If I pray many words and say with my lips that I love God, yet fail to live according to His will, then God remains only on my lips and not truly in my heart.

Living the Word:

With yourself: Identify what habits or pleasures take priority over your worship of God, and have the courage to let them go.

With others: Learn to recognize God dwelling in them, just as God dwells within you.

With God: Each day, make a personal appointment with the Lord and set aside a special, dedicated time for Him.

Prayer: Lord, many times the house of my heart has been empty of You—because I have forgotten You, because I have allowed worldly things to fill my soul. From this day forward, I invite You to come and be the true Master of my heart. Amen.

Monday: Believe in the Miracle Before Your Eyes - Luke 4:24–30

Many people are willing to travel great distances in order to witness a miracle. Yet there is a miracle right before our eyes every time we participate in the Holy Mass: the miracle of the Eucharist, when bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ. This miracle was affirmed by Jesus Himself. This miracle takes place at every daily Mass, but we often take it for granted and struggle to believe—precisely because it happens so regularly and because our eyes do not see the change. When our faith is weak and we treat the Eucharistic miracle casually, we may receive Holy Communion without allowing anything to truly happen within us. And yet, when Jesus enters our hearts, something should change. Being touched by the Lord should awaken in us a desire for conversion and an awareness of healing. This inner transformation is, in fact, a miracle even greater than the visible signs we often seek.

Living the Word:

With yourself: Believe in the Eucharist and in the Lord's living presence within your heart.

With others: Do not be discouraged when people misunderstand you or when they refuse to listen about God.

With God: Give thanks for the Eucharist and for the abiding presence of the Holy Spirit.

Prayer: Father, grant me a strong and living faith in Your presence within me, especially in the Eucharist. I thank You for Your patience with my weaknesses and struggles in faith. Amen.

Tuesday: Forgive Seventy Times Seven - Matthew 18:21–35

Peter came to Jesus and asked, “Lord, if my brother or sister sins against me, how many times must I forgive? As many as seven times?” Jesus answered, “I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven.” He is inviting us to forgive without limits. Our real challenge is not forgiving those we love, but forgiving those who have hurt us, even those we may consider our enemies. At times, the people we love the most can become the ones who wound us the deepest. When we refuse to forgive, we are always the ones who lose. We carry resentment and bitterness in our hearts, and unforgiveness becomes a double-edged sword that wounds both our soul and our body. Forgiveness, on the other hand, brings freedom and healing. The moment we choose to forgive is the moment we begin to be set free.

Living the Word:

With yourself: Make a firm decision to forgive those who have hurt you.

With others: Pray for those who have caused you pain, even for those you consider enemies.

With God: Ask the Lord for the strength and courage needed to forgive.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, You teach me to forgive others without conditions. During this Lenten season, I ask You to help me forgive everyone completely, so that I may be truly free. Grant me a new heart, filled only with love and peace. Amen

Wednesday: Faithful to the Law of the Lord - Matthew 5:17–19

In the Ten Commandments that God gave to Moses on Mount Sinai, the first three express our duty toward God, while the remaining seven guide our relationships with one another. In today's world, however, there is a growing tendency not to uphold the law, but to set it aside. Practices such as divorce or living together before marriage are often seen as normal and acceptable. Today's Gospel calls our hearts back to vigilance. Jesus reminds us that not even the smallest part of the law will pass away until all is fulfilled, and that whoever breaks even the least of these commandments and teaches others to do so will be considered least in the Kingdom of Heaven. The role of parents and those entrusted with responsibility is especially important: by their example and guidance, they help others learn to respect and live according to God's commandments. To keep the Lord's law with a renewed heart is truly pleasing to God.

Living the Word:

With yourself: Remain faithful in observing God's commandments. Make an effort not to arrive late to Mass or leave early.

With others: Gently remind and encourage them to live according to God's commandments.

With God: Ask forgiveness for times you have failed to keep His commandments, and pray for the gift of fear of the Lord.

Prayer: Lord, living in today's society, there are times when I have ignored the call to keep Your commandments.

Help me to recognize the great value of the Holy Mass and to participate with devotion and reverence. Amen.

Thursday: Walk in the Ways of the Lord - Jeremiah 7:23–28

As society becomes more advanced and modern, people often grow more careless in keeping God's commandments. Many no longer attend Sunday Mass or go to Confession regularly. Yet when difficulties or crises arise, churches suddenly become crowded. Looking back to the Old Testament, we see that whenever the people of Israel turned away from God, they were defeated by their enemies. But when they returned to the Lord, God protected them and granted them victory. The Lord says, "Walk in all the ways that I command you, so that you may prosper." We cannot remain on the path of sin and still expect God's blessings. Nor can we turn to God only when we are in need. We are called to be faithful to the Lord at all times—in moments of prosperity as well as in times of hardship—always giving thanks and placing our trust in Him in every circumstance.

Living the Word:

With yourself: Observe and live God's commandments with a loving and willing heart.

With others: Pray for those who are living far from God, that they may return to Him.

With God: Ask for the gift of holy fear and for the grace of steadfast fidelity to the Lord.

Prayer: Lord, show me Your ways and give me an obedient heart to walk in Your paths. Help me recognize the ways of my own choosing that are not Yours, and lead me back to the straight and narrow path of Your truth. Amen.

Friday: Renouncing Superstition, False Beliefs, and Idols - Hosea 14:2–10

Everyone has idols shaped by personal tastes. Those who love music may idolize a singer. Sports fans may idolize an athlete. Others may idolize a movie star. But is God truly the center of our lives? Whenever Israel turned away from the Lord to worship other gods, they suffered the consequences. Yet one truth remains clear: God loves us with the tender love of a father and a mother, with the faithful passion of a beloved. Still, our world today often turns away from God, chasing after idols of wealth, power, success, and possessions—idols made by human hands. Today the Lord asks us the same question He once asked Ephraim: "O Ephraim, what have idols to do with you? Can they really help you?" This question invites us to examine our hearts and rediscover the one true God who alone gives life.

Living the Word:

With myself: Let go of attachments, passions, and pleasures that take priority over God and consume my time.

With others: Help lead them back to God. Help them recognize how deeply God loves them.

With God: Acknowledge the Lord as the one true God. Profess that my life belongs to Him alone.

Prayer: Lord, I desire to renounce the worldly idols that dominate and influence my life. Let me experience You with a living, sensitive heart, so that I may recognize Your presence with me in every moment of my life. Amen.

Saturday: "Lord, Have Mercy on Me, a Sinner" - Luke 18:9–14

Throughout the stories in the Bible, the tax collectors, adulterers, prodigals, thieves, the sick, the poor, and widows—are often the ones who most readily receive God's saving grace, more than those who see themselves as wise or righteous. Their path to salvation is simple and sincere: they acknowledge their sinfulness, place their trust in God, and repent with a humble heart. The great danger for us is our spiritual pride. Without noticing our sins, it is difficult for us to experience God's mercy and love.

Living the Word:

With myself: Live in continual humility and repentance.

With others: Avoid judging, thinking that one person is destined for hell while another is righteous.

With God: Trust in God's mercy and ask Him to forgive my sins.

Prayer: Father, have mercy on me, for I am a sinner. With a contrite heart, I repent and turn back to You. Thank You for a love that is greater than all my sins. Hold me close to Your heart, so that I may feel Your love, recognize my smallness and weakness, and learn to rely completely on You. I love You. Amen.

Camino Cuaresmal con el Padre Timothy

En esta Cuaresma, mientras recorremos juntos este camino, los animo a tener siempre la Biblia a mano, permitiendo que la Palabra de Dios guíe su reflexión diaria a través de cada meditación. Ahora, caminemos, oremos y crezcamos en cercanía con Dios—juntos.

Tercer Domingo de Cuaresma: No Dejes que tu Corazón Esté Vacío de Dios - Juan 2, 13–25

La ausencia de Dios en nuestro corazón no significa necesariamente que dejemos de ir a Misa, de recibir la Sagrada Comunión o de confesarnos. Dios es amor. Por lo tanto, cada vez que dejamos de amar—cuando en nuestro corazón anidan la ira, los celos, el resentimiento, el odio o la amargura—nuestro corazón, en realidad, está vacío de Dios. Otra forma de vacío ocurre cuando permitimos que otro "señor" tome posesión de nuestro corazón: el dinero, la belleza física, la fama, el estatus, el orgullo o la autoimportancia. Dios ha hablado con claridad: «Nadie puede servir a dos señores; porque amaré a uno y odiará al otro». Entonces, ¿cómo podemos saber quién reina verdaderamente en nuestro corazón? Hay señales que nos ayudan a reconocerlo. Aquello a lo que vuelven con mayor frecuencia nuestros pensamientos, deseos y anhelos—lo que ocupa nuestra mente y nuestra energía—suele ser nuestro verdadero señor. Si rezo muchas palabras y digo con mis labios que amo a Dios, pero no vivo según su voluntad, entonces Dios permanece solo en mis labios y no verdaderamente en mi corazón.

Vivir la Palabra:

Con uno mismo: Identifica qué hábitos o placeres tienen prioridad sobre tu adoración a Dios y ten el valor de dejarlos ir.

Con los demás: Aprende a reconocer a Dios que habita en ellos, así como Dios habita dentro de ti.

Con Dios: Cada día, haz una cita personal con el Señor y reserva un tiempo especial y dedicado solo para Él.

Oración: Señor, muchas veces la casa de mi corazón ha estado vacía de Ti—porque me he olvidado de Ti, porque he permitido que las cosas del mundo llenen mi alma. Desde hoy, te invito a venir y a ser el verdadero Dueño de mi corazón. Amén

Lunes: Cree en el Milagro que Está Ante tus Ojos - Lucas 4, 24-30

Muchas personas están dispuestas a viajar grandes distancias para presenciar un milagro. Sin embargo, hay un milagro ante nuestros ojos cada vez que participamos en la Santa Misa: el milagro de la Eucaristía, cuando el pan y el vino se transforman en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Este milagro fue confirmado por el mismo Jesús. Este milagro ocurre en cada Misa diaria, pero con frecuencia lo damos por sentado y nos cuesta creer—precisamente porque sucede tan a menudo y porque nuestros ojos no ven el cambio. Cuando nuestra fe es débil y tratamos el milagro eucarístico con superficialidad, podemos recibir la Sagrada Comunión sin permitir que algo cambie verdaderamente dentro de nosotros. Y, sin embargo, cuando Jesús entra en nuestro corazón, algo debería transformarse. Ser tocados por el Señor debería despertar en nosotros un deseo de conversión y una conciencia de sanación. Esta transformación interior es, de hecho, un milagro aún mayor que los signos visibles que solemos buscar.

Vivir la Palabra

Con uno mismo: Cree en la Eucaristía y en la presencia viva del Señor en tu corazón.

Con los demás: No te desanimes cuando las personas te malinterpreten o se nieguen a escuchar sobre Dios.

Con Dios: Da gracias por la Eucaristía y por la presencia permanente del Espíritu Santo.

Oración: Padre, concédeme una fe fuerte y viva en tu presencia dentro de mí, especialmente en la Eucaristía. Te doy gracias por tu paciencia con mis debilidades y luchas en la fe. Amén.

Martes: Perdonar Setenta Veces Siete - Mateo 18, 21-35

Pedro se acercó a Jesús y le preguntó: «Señor, si mi hermano o mi hermana peca contra mí, ¿cuántas veces debo perdonar? ¿Hasta siete veces?». Jesús le respondió: «No te digo hasta siete veces, sino hasta setenta veces siete». Jesús nos invita a perdonar sin límites. Nuestro verdadero desafío no es perdonar a quienes amamos, sino perdonar a quienes nos han herido, incluso a quienes consideramos enemigos. A veces, las personas que más amamos pueden convertirse en las que más profundamente nos hieren. Cuando nos negamos a perdonar, siempre somos nosotros los que perdemos. Cargamos resentimiento y amargura en el corazón, y la falta de perdón se convierte en una espada de doble filo que hiera tanto nuestra alma como nuestro cuerpo. El perdón, en cambio, trae libertad y sanación. El momento en que decidimos perdonar es el momento en que comenzamos a ser liberados.

Vivir la Palabra

Con uno mismo: Toma una decisión firme de perdonar a quienes te han herido.

Con los demás: Ora por quienes te han causado dolor, incluso por aquellos que consideras enemigos.

Con Dios: Pide al Señor la fuerza y el valor necesarios para perdonar.

Oración: Señor Jesús, Tú me enseñas a perdonar a los demás sin condiciones. En este tiempo de Cuaresma, te pido que me ayudes a perdonar completamente a todos, para que pueda ser verdaderamente libre. Concédeme un corazón nuevo, lleno solo de amor y de paz. Amén.

Miércoles: Fieles a la Ley del Señor - Mateo 5, 17-19

En los Diez Mandamientos que Dios dio a Moisés en el monte Sinaí, los tres primeros expresan nuestro deber hacia Dios, mientras que los siete restantes orientan nuestras relaciones con los demás. Sin embargo, en el mundo actual existe una tendencia creciente no a respetar la ley, sino a dejarla de lado. Prácticas como el divorcio o la convivencia antes del matrimonio suelen considerarse normales y aceptables. El Evangelio de hoy llama a nuestro corazón a la vigilancia. Jesús nos recuerda que ni siquiera la parte más pequeña de la ley pasará hasta que todo se cumpla, y que quien quebrante uno de estos mandamientos, aun el más pequeño, y enseñe a otros a hacer lo mismo, será considerado el menor en el Reino de los Cielos. El papel de los padres y de quienes han recibido una responsabilidad es especialmente importante: con su ejemplo y orientación ayudan a otros a aprender a respetar y vivir según los mandamientos de Dios. Guardar la ley del Señor con un corazón renovado es verdaderamente agradable a Dios.

Vivir la Palabra

Con uno mismo: Permanece fiel en la observancia de los mandamientos de Dios. Esfuérzate por no llegar tarde a la Misa ni salir antes de que termine.

Con los demás: Recuérdales y anímalos con suavidad a vivir según los mandamientos de Dios.

Con Dios: Pide perdón por las veces en que no has cumplido sus mandamientos y ora por el don del santo temor de Dios.

Oración: Señor, al vivir en la sociedad actual, hay momentos en los que he ignorado el llamado a cumplir tus mandamientos. Ayúdame a reconocer el gran valor de la Santa Misa y a participar en ella con devoción y reverencia.

Jueves: Camina por los Caminos del Señor - Jeremías 7, 23-28

A medida que la sociedad se vuelve más avanzada y moderna, las personas suelen volverse más descuidadas en el cumplimiento de los mandamientos de Dios. Muchos ya no asisten a la Misa dominical ni se confiesan con regularidad. Sin embargo, cuando surgen dificultades o crisis, las iglesias de repente se llenan. Al mirar al Antiguo Testamento, vemos que cada vez que el pueblo de Israel se apartaba de Dios, era derrotado por sus enemigos. Pero cuando regresaban al Señor, Dios los protegía y les concedía la victoria. El Señor dice: «Caminen por todos los caminos que yo les mando, para que les vaya bien». No podemos permanecer en el camino del pecado y aun así esperar las bendiciones de Dios. Tampoco podemos acudir a Dios solo cuando lo necesitamos. Estamos llamados a ser fieles al Señor en todo momento—tanto en la prosperidad como en la dificultad—dando siempre gracias y poniendo nuestra confianza en Él en toda circunstancia.

Vivir la Palabra

Con uno mismo: Observa y vive los mandamientos de Dios con un corazón amoroso y dispuesto.

Con los demás: Ora por quienes viven alejados de Dios, para que regresen a Él.

Con Dios: Pide el don del santo temor y la gracia de una fidelidad constante al Señor.

Oración: Señor, muéstrame tus caminos y dame un corazón obediente para andar por tus sendas. Ayúdame a reconocer los caminos que yo mismo he elegido y que no son los tuyos, y condúceme de nuevo por el sendero recto y estrecho de tu verdad. Amén.

Viernes: Renunciar a la Superstición, a las Falsas Creencias y a los Ídolos - Oseas 14, 2-10

Todos tenemos ídolos moldeados por gustos personales. Quienes aman la música pueden idolatrar a un cantante; los aficionados al deporte, a un atleta; otros, a una estrella de cine. Pero ¿es Dios realmente el centro de nuestra vida?

Cada vez que Israel se apartó del Señor para adorar a otros dioses, sufrió las consecuencias. Sin embargo, una verdad permanece clara: Dios nos ama con el tierno amor de un padre y de una madre, con la pasión fiel de un amado. Aun así, nuestro mundo de hoy con frecuencia se aleja de Dios, persiguiendo ídolos de riqueza, poder, éxito y posesiones—ídolos hechos por manos humanas. Hoy el Señor nos hace la misma pregunta que una vez dirigió a Efraín: «Efraín, ¿qué tienes tú que ver con los ídolos? ¿Acaso pueden ellos ayudarte?». Esta pregunta nos invita a examinar nuestro corazón y a redescubrir al único Dios verdadero, el único que da la vida.

Vivir la Palabra

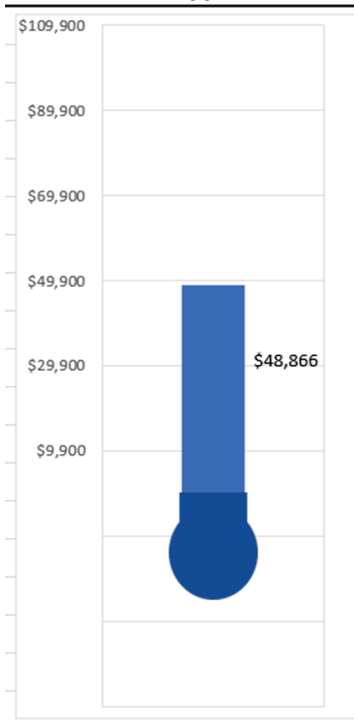

Vivimos en una de las naciones más ricas en una de las épocas más prósperas de la historia del mundo. Nuestra vida está llena de comodidades y tiempo para el ocio. Encendemos un interruptor y la habitación se ilumina. Podemos saciar nuestra hambre rápidamente metiendo comida en el microondas o pasando por el autoservicio de camino a casa después del trabajo. ¿Necesitas agua? Abre la llave. No hay necesidad de ir al pozo. Pero padecemos un tipo diferente de pobreza: la pobreza de espíritu.

Qué suerte tuvo la samaritana de no vivir en nuestro tiempo, o de ser así podría haber perdido su oportunidad de redención. Que Jesús le hablara, e incluso le pidiera de beber, es algo inaudito. Se consideraba que los samaritanos eran "inferiores" e indignos de tratar con ellos. Pero Jesús va aún más allá. Cuando ella dice que el Mesías viene, Jesús se le revela: " Soy yo, el que habla contigo". La mujer recibe su mensaje y cree en él y su vida cambia para siempre. Con Jesús, nadie está fuera del redil, ni siquiera los samaritanos, y nadie está excluido de la redención, ni siquiera el peor de los pecadores.

¿Nos acercan nuestras prioridades a Nuestro Señor?
¿Vivimos según el plan que Dios tiene para nosotros?
¿Llenamos nuestra "cubeta" de Cristo? Como discípulos suyos, estamos llamados a vivir con el cielo como meta, ¡y también a traer con nosotros a tantos como sea posible! Los programas y ministerios que apoya el Fondo de Desarrollo Diocesano unen a las personas a Nuestro Señor. Esta Cuaresma, les pedimos que consideren el DDF como una forma de hacer caridad.


We live in one of the wealthiest nations in one of the most prosperous times in the history of the world. Our life is full of convenience and time for leisure. We flip a switch, and a room is illuminated. We can satiate our hunger quickly by popping food in a microwave or hitting a drive-thru on the way home from work. Need water? Turn on the tap.

There's no need to go to the well. But we are afflicted with a different kind of poverty, a poverty of spirit.

Good thing for Samaritan woman that she didn't live in our time, or she might have missed her chance for redemption. Jesus speaking to her, let alone asking her for a drink, is unheard of.

Samaritans are considered "less than" and not worthy of interaction. But he goes even further. When she says the Messiah is coming, Jesus reveals himself to her: "I am he, the one who is speaking with you." His message is received, and believed, and her life is changed forever. With Jesus, no one is outside the fold—not even Samaritans—and no one is beyond redemption—not even the gravest sinner.

Are our priorities bringing us closer to Our Lord? Are we living according to God's plan for us? Are we filling our "bucket" with Christ? As his disciples, we are called to live with heaven in mind, and we are also called to bring as many people as we can with us! The programs and ministries that the Diocesan Development Fund support unite people with Our Lord. This Lent, please consider the DDF as a way of giving alms.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

March 8, 2026

3rd Sunday of Lent

John 4:5-42

Recently I received a note from a teenager I met years ago. He wrote, “Dear Father Muir, you probably do not remember me, but I wanted to thank you for your inspiring and humorous homilies at the parish. They helped me appreciate the beauty of Catholicism, which I have now embraced in a personal way.” That small note moved me more than he probably imagined. I had no idea my words had taken root in him. I was simply sowing seeds — week by week, Mass by Mass. Someone else — his parents, a youth minister, or God Himself — was doing the deeper work. Now this young man is joyfully reaping a harvest of faith.

In today’s Gospel, Jesus offers living water to a Samaritan woman whose life had been full of searching and disappointment. By the end of their encounter, she becomes a bold and joyful evangelist. Then Jesus turns to his disciples and says something easily overlooked: “One sows and another reaps” (John 4:37). He is helping them — and us — understand how evangelization works. Often, the one who sows the seeds of faith is not the one who sees the fruit.

This Lent, ask yourself: Are you in a sowing phase or a reaping phase? If you are sowing — raising children, praying for someone, mentoring — be patient. Your work matters. If you are reaping — seeing someone come alive in faith — be grateful. You are standing on sacred ground, tilled and watered by others.

Lenten challenge: Thank someone who once sowed faith into your life. And keep sowing, even when the harvest is unseen.

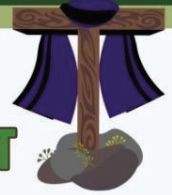
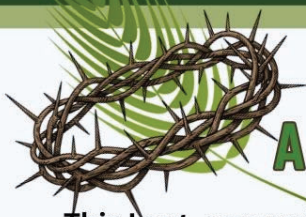

Señor, como a la samaritana, hazme testigo de tu Evangelio. Para lograrlo, recordemos que el Espíritu Santo, desde nuestro Bautismo, ha sido derramado en nosotros como fuente de agua viva.

No hay excusa para no participar como discípulos misioneros en nuestras parroquias, en la familia y en la sociedad.

¡Señor, dame de esa agua, y así ya no sufriré más sed!
