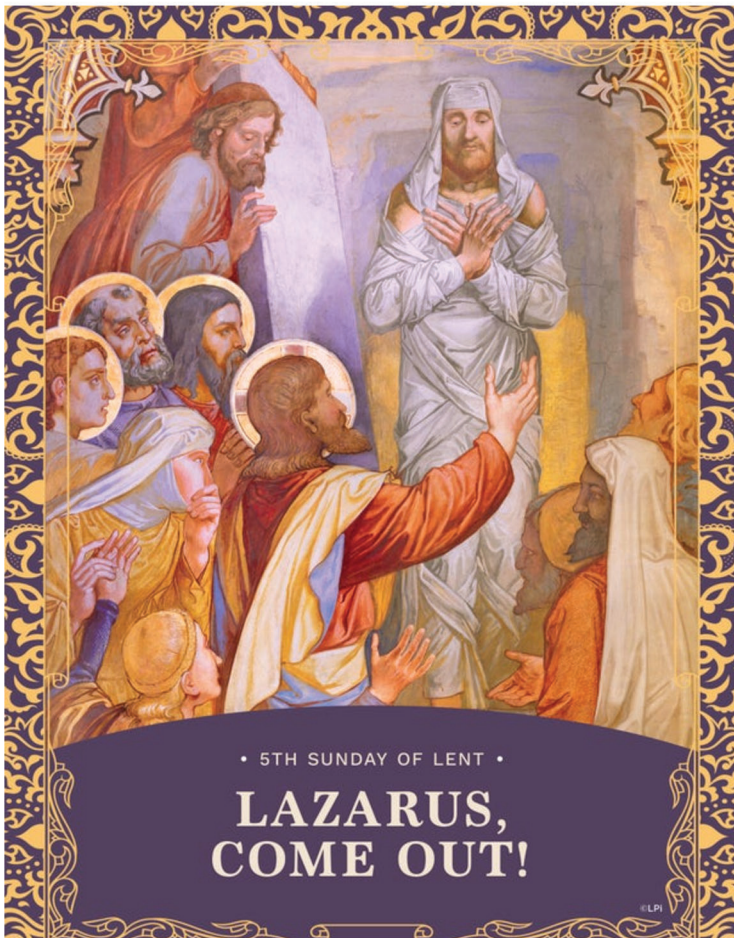

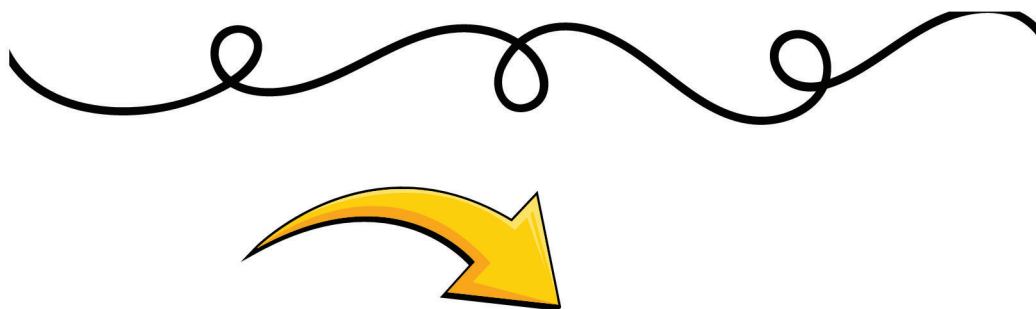

Lenten Journey with Father Timothy

This Lent, as we continue to walk this path together, I encourage you to keep a Bible close at hand, allowing God's Word to guide your daily reflection through each day's sharing. Let us journey, pray, and grow closer to God—together.

Fifth Sunday of Lent: Sowing the Seeds of Faith - John 12:20-33

He tells us, "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain." What Jesus is teaching us is profound and deeply personal. A seed that refuses to fall into the soil remains alone—isolated, closed in on itself, and unable to bear fruit. This kind of "aloneness" reflects a life centered only on self, a life that does not open itself to love or generosity. The seed of faith within our hearts cannot grow or bear fruit unless we are willing to "die" to ourselves—our selfishness, our pride, our comfort—and offer ourselves in love for others. Faith matures through sacrifice, generosity, and self-giving. Just as a seed multiplies, we are called not only to let faith bear fruit in our own lives, but also to sow the seeds of faith in our families, in our workplaces, and among all those we meet, according to our abilities. The seeds we are asked to plant are seeds of love and charity.

Living the Word

Within ourselves: Proclaim the Gospel through daily sacrifices, service, and the gifts God has given us.

With others: Speak about God with kindness; share stories of what the Lord has done in your life.

With God: Surrender yourself as His instrument. Trust not in your own strength, but in the power of God at work within you.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, I have received Your love and Your light, and You invite me to be a sower of Your seeds. Help me to sow love where there is hatred, forgiveness where there is resentment, peace where there is conflict, and truth where there is error.

May my life bear fruit for Your Kingdom. Amen.

Monday: Put Down the Stone - John 8:1-11

Jesus often speaks words of compassion toward sinners. He gently but firmly turns to those who accuse sinners, "Look at yourselves." Jesus invites each of us to examine our own hearts. It is often easy for us to see the faults of others, while at the same time finding excuses for our own weaknesses. Only a humble heart can receive forgiveness. Jesus calls us to look honestly at ourselves: at our actions, our words, and even our religious practices. When we have the courage to examine ourselves, Jesus then asks us to do something very simple, yet very challenging: to put down the stone. To let go of judgment. To walk away quietly, trusting ourselves to the mercy of God.

Living the Word

With ourselves: Take time for honest self-examination. Acknowledge our own weaknesses and need for mercy.

With others: Do not condemn. Instead, offer understanding and create space for conversion and healing.

With God: Give thanks for His kindness, patience, and forgiving love.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, help me to know myself as I truly am. Give me the humility to recognize my own sins and the grace not to judge others. Teach me to offer others the same patience and mercy that I desire for myself. May I put down the stones I carry in my heart and trust fully in Your compassion. Amen.

Tuesday: God Is With Us - John 8:21-30

Though Jesus is truly God, He humbled Himself to take on our human nature so that He might live among us. Later, He reassured His disciples with these words: "I am with you always, until the end of the age." At the beginning of every Mass, the priest greets the assembly by saying, "The Lord be with you," and the people respond, "And with your spirit." In that exchange, we proclaim a beautiful truth: the Lord is truly present with all of us. And yet, many times we live as if God is only with us inside the church. Once we step outside, we lose that awareness. We forget that He continues to dwell within us and among us. When we forget God's presence, we may hurt one another through our words, our actions, or our indifference. There is no greater happiness than knowing God is with us, for where God is, there is fullness of life. To have God is to have everything.

Living the Word

With ourselves: Speak with the Lord as with a close and trusted friend.

With others: Recognize God's presence in them. See each person as a beloved son or daughter of God.

With God: Place your trust firmly in His living and constant presence.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, I believe that You are with me and that You are present in my brothers and sisters. Thank You for patiently staying with us, even when we are distracted or indifferent. Increase my faith, Lord, for my faith is still weak. Amen

Wednesday: Everyone Who Commits Sin Is a Slave to Sin - John 8:31-42

Jesus speaks a challenging truth: "Everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin." In these words, the Lord reveals that slavery can take many forms. Even when we appear free on the outside, we may still be bound on the inside—by sin, habits, fears, or selfishness. Like those who are trapped in human slavery, we cannot free ourselves by our own strength. We are in need of redemption. Only Jesus Christ can rescue us from sin and from eternal death. When Jesus is absent from our lives, we remain enslaved. When Jesus is present, He breaks our chains and leads us into true freedom. "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."

Living the Word

With ourselves: Place your trust in Jesus and rely on His saving grace.

With others: Pray for them, asking the Lord to free all who are bound or oppressed in any way.

With God: Give thanks for the salvation Jesus has won for us. Ask Him to protect you and continually free you from sin.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, I thank You for coming to break the chains of sin and to set me free as a child of God. Help me to recognize sin clearly and to turn away from it, so that I may no longer live as a slave, but walk in the freedom You give. Amen.

Thursday: If I Glorify Myself, My Glory Is Worth Nothing - John 8:51-59

Jesus says to us today, “If I glorify myself, my glory is worth nothing.” With these words, He gently teaches us the difference between human praise and true glory. When we glorify ourselves, our actions are centered on our own interests, and their value remains limited to us alone. Even when others praise or admire us, that honor lasts only for this life and soon fades away. But when we live to glorify God, our lives are opened to His blessing, and our actions take on an eternal meaning. Jesus Himself did not seek His own glory. Everything He said and did was directed toward honoring the Father. He invites us to walk the same path—to shift the focus from ourselves and to give glory to God in all things. Today, let us choose to offer our praise and honor to Jesus Christ, our Lord and our God.

Living the Word

With ourselves: Pray the Glory Be each day, offering praise and honor to God.

With others: Praise God on their behalf and gently guide them to give glory to Him.

With God: Glorify the Father daily and bless the holy name of Jesus.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, I praise and glorify You, for You alone are worthy of all honor and praise. Help me to direct everything I do toward You, so that others may come to know and glorify You as well. Amen.

Friday: God Dwells in Me, and I Dwell in God - John 10:31-42

We often hear people say, “This person has God,” or “That person does not.” Sometimes we even hear, “God told me this,” while someone else says, “God told me something different.” Yet there is only one God and one Christ. God is not different from one person to another. What differs is our awareness and openness to His presence. Many of us believe in God, yet we hesitate to believe—or to trust—that our own bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit. We may feel unworthy because of our sins or weaknesses. But Jesus did not come for the righteous; He came to heal and save sinners. God’s mercy is greater than our unworthiness. When we truly recognize that God dwells within us, we are called to respond with faith and gratitude. We are invited to trust in His mercy and to live in a way that honors our bodies as sacred dwelling places of His presence. Our lives then become a quiet testimony: God lives in me, and I live in God.

Living the Word

With ourselves: Acknowledge God’s presence within you. Care for your body and keep it pure and worthy as God’s temple.

With others: Thank God for His presence in them. Live in such a way that others can recognize God living in you.

With God: Give thanks to the Lord for dwelling within you and for saving you with His mercy.

Prayer: Lord God, thank You for dwelling within me, so that I may dwell in You. Help me to recognize and experience Your presence within me more deeply each day. Grant me the grace to care for my body with purity and integrity, so that You may always delight in making Your home within me. Amen.

Saturday: Better to Die Once Than to Be Lost Forever - John 11:45-56

Many people say, “When I retire, I will have more time to serve the parish,” or “Someday, I will get more involved.” Yet tomorrow belongs to God alone. As human beings, we are given only today. We do not know what tomorrow will bring.

If someone were to ask us, “When will you return to your family? When will you forgive? When will you repent? When will you truly believe? When will you serve the Lord with your whole heart?” The only honest and faithful answer is always the same: today, not tomorrow. Jesus reminds us that life is precious and urgent. To delay conversion, love, and faith is to risk losing what truly matters. Therefore, we are invited to live our faith and love for God today, as if it were the last day of our lives. This does not mean living in fear, but living with purpose, sincerity, and trust in God’s mercy.

Living the Word

With ourselves: Live today’s faith and love for God as if today were your last day.

With others: Remember that no one reaches heaven alone; walk with others and accompany them on the journey of faith.

With God: Give thanks to Christ, who died so that we might truly live.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, teach me to live this day as if it were the last day of my life. Help me to live honestly before You and truthfully before myself. Grant me the grace to respond to Your call today, not tomorrow, for tomorrow will have its own call. I place this day into Your hands. Amen.



En esta Cuaresma, mientras recorremos juntos este camino, los animo a tener siempre a mano la Biblia, permitiendo que la Palabra de Dios guíe su reflexión diaria a través de cada día de esta experiencia compartida. Caminemos, oremos y acerquémonos más a Dios —juntos.

Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma: Sembrar las Semillas de la Fe - Juan 12, 20-33

Jesús nos dice: “Si el grano de trigo no cae en tierra y muere, queda solo”. Lo que Jesús nos enseña es profundo y muy personal. Una semilla que se niega a caer en la tierra permanece sola—aislada, cerrada en sí misma e incapaz de dar fruto. Esta “soledad” refleja una vida centrada únicamente en uno mismo, una vida que no se abre al amor ni a la generosidad. La semilla de la fe en nuestro corazón no puede crecer ni dar fruto si no estamos dispuestos a “morir” a nosotros mismos—al egoísmo, al orgullo, a la comodidad—y a ofrecernos con amor por los demás. La fe madura a través del sacrificio, la generosidad y la entrega de sí. Así como una semilla se multiplica, también nosotros estamos llamados no solo a dejar que la fe dé fruto en nuestra propia vida, sino a sembrar semillas de fe en nuestras familias, en nuestros lugares de trabajo y entre todos los que encontramos, según nuestras capacidades. Las semillas que estamos llamados a sembrar son semillas de amor y caridad.

Vivir la Palabra

Dentro de nosotros mismos: Proclamar el Evangelio mediante los sacrificios diarios, el servicio y los dones que Dios nos ha dado.

Con los demás: Hablar de Dios con bondad; compartir testimonios de lo que el Señor ha hecho en tu vida.

Con Dios: Entrégate como instrumento suyo. No confíes en tus propias fuerzas, sino en el poder de Dios que actúa en ti.

Oración: Señor Jesús, he recibido tu amor y tu luz, y Tú me invitas a ser sembrador de tus semillas. Ayúdame a sembrar amor donde hay odio, perdón donde hay resentimiento, paz donde hay conflicto y verdad donde hay error. Que mi vida dé fruto para tu Reino. Amén.

Lunes: Deja la Piedra - Juan 8, 1-11

Jesús habla a menudo con palabras de compasión hacia los pecadores. Con suavidad pero con firmeza se dirige a quienes los acusan y les dice: “Mírense a ustedes mismos”. Jesús nos invita a examinar nuestro propio corazón. Muchas veces nos resulta fácil ver las faltas de los demás, mientras al mismo tiempo encontramos excusas para nuestras propias debilidades. Solo un corazón humilde puede recibir el perdón. Jesús nos llama a mirarnos con honestidad: nuestras acciones, nuestras palabras e incluso nuestras prácticas religiosas. Cuando tenemos el valor de examinarnos, Jesús nos pide algo muy sencillo y a la vez muy desafiante: dejar la piedra, soltar el juicio y alejarnos en silencio, confiándonos a la misericordia de Dios.

Vivir la Palabra

Con nosotros mismos: Dedicar tiempo a un examen de conciencia sincero. Reconocer nuestras debilidades y nuestra necesidad de misericordia.

Con los demás: No condenar; ofrecer comprensión y crear espacio para la conversión y la sanación.

Con Dios: Dar gracias por su bondad, paciencia y amor misericordioso.

Oración: Señor Jesús, ayúdame a conocerme tal como soy. Dame la humildad para reconocer mis propios pecados y la gracia de no juzgar a los demás. Enséñame a ofrecer a los demás la misma paciencia y misericordia que deseo para mí. Que deje las piedras que llevo en el corazón y confíe plenamente en tu compasión. Amén.

Martes: Dios Está con Nosotros - Juan 8, 21-30

Aunque Jesús es verdaderamente Dios, se humilló al asumir nuestra naturaleza humana para vivir entre nosotros. Más tarde aseguró a sus discípulos: “Yo estaré con ustedes todos los días hasta el fin del mundo”. Al inicio de cada Misa, el sacerdote saluda a la asamblea diciendo: “El Señor esté con ustedes”, y el pueblo responde: “Y con tu espíritu”. En ese diálogo proclamamos una verdad hermosa: el Señor está verdaderamente presente entre nosotros. Sin embargo, muchas veces vivimos como si Dios estuviera solo dentro de la iglesia. Al salir, perdemos esa conciencia. Olvidamos que Él sigue habitando en nosotros y entre nosotros. Cuando olvidamos su presencia, podemos herir a los demás con nuestras palabras, acciones o indiferencia. No hay mayor felicidad que saber que Dios está con nosotros, porque donde está Dios hay plenitud de vida. Tener a Dios es tenerlo todo.

Vivir la Palabra

Con nosotros mismos: Hablar con el Señor como con un amigo cercano y de confianza.

Con los demás: Reconocer la presencia de Dios en ellos; ver a cada persona como hijo o hija amada de Dios.

Con Dios: Confiar firmemente en su presencia viva y constante.

Oración: Señor Jesús, creo que Tú estás conmigo y que estás presente en mis hermanos y hermanas. Gracias por permanecer pacientemente con nosotros, aun cuando estamos distraídos o indiferentes. Aumenta mi fe, Señor, porque mi fe todavía es débil. Amén.



Miércoles: Todo el que Peca es Esclavo del Pecado - Juan 8, 31-42

Jesús nos dice una verdad exigente: “Todo el que peca es esclavo del pecado”. Con estas palabras, el Señor nos revela que la esclavitud puede tomar muchas formas. Aunque por fuera parezcamos libres, por dentro podemos estar atados—al pecado, a hábitos, a miedos o al egoísmo. Como quienes viven en esclavitud humana, no podemos liberarnos por nuestras propias fuerzas. Necesitamos redención. Solo Jesucristo puede rescatarnos del pecado y de la muerte eterna. Cuando Jesús está ausente de nuestra vida, permanecemos esclavos. Cuando Jesús está presente, rompe nuestras cadenas y nos conduce a la verdadera libertad. “Si el Hijo los libera, serán verdaderamente libres”.

Vivir la Palabra

Con nosotros mismos: Confiar en Jesús y apoyarnos en su gracia salvadora.

Con los demás: Orar por ellos, pidiendo al Señor que libere a todos los que están atados u oprimidos de cualquier manera.

Con Dios: Dar gracias por la salvación que Jesús nos ha ganado. Pedirle que nos proteja y nos libere continuamente del pecado.

Oración: Señor Jesús, gracias por venir a romper las cadenas del pecado y a liberarme como hijo de Dios. Ayúdame a reconocer claramente el pecado y a apartarme de él, para que ya no viva como esclavo, sino que camine en la libertad que Tú me das. Amén.

Jueves: Si Yo Me Glorifico, Mi Gloria No Vale Nada - Juan 8, 51-59

Jesús nos dice hoy: “Si yo me glorifico a mí mismo, mi gloria no vale nada”. Con estas palabras nos enseña suavemente la diferencia entre la alabanza humana y la verdadera gloria. Cuando nos glorificamos a nosotros mismos, nuestras acciones se centran en nuestros propios intereses y su valor queda limitado a nosotros. Incluso cuando otros nos alaban, ese honor es pasajero y pronto desaparece. Pero cuando vivimos para glorificar a Dios, nuestra vida se abre a su bendición y nuestras acciones adquieren un sentido eterno. Jesús mismo no buscó su propia gloria. Todo lo que dijo e hizo estuvo dirigido a glorificar al Padre. Nos invita a seguir el mismo camino: dejar de centrarnos en nosotros y dar gloria a Dios en todo. Hoy elijamos ofrecer nuestra alabanza y honor a Jesucristo, nuestro Señor y nuestro Dios.

Vivir la Palabra

Con nosotros mismos: Rezar cada día el Gloria, ofreciendo alabanza y honor a Dios.

Con los demás: Alabar a Dios por ellos y guiarlos suavemente a darle gloria.

Con Dios: Glorificar al Padre cada día y bendecir el santo nombre de Jesús.

Oración: Padre celestial, te alabo y te glorifico, porque solo Tú eres digno de todo honor y alabanza. Ayúdame a dirigir todo lo que hago hacia Ti, para que otros también lleguen a conocerte y glorificarte. Amén.

Viernes: Dios Habita en Mí y Yo Habito en Dios - Juan 10, 31-42

A menudo escuchamos decir: “Esta persona tiene a Dios” o “aquella no lo tiene”. A veces incluso oímos: “Dios me dijo esto”, mientras otro dice: “Dios me dijo algo distinto”. Sin embargo, hay un solo Dios y un solo Cristo. Dios no cambia de una persona a otra; lo que cambia es nuestra conciencia y apertura a su presencia. Muchos creemos en Dios, pero dudamos en creer—o en confiar—que nuestro propio cuerpo es templo del Espíritu Santo. Podemos sentirnos indignos por nuestros pecados o debilidades. Pero Jesús no vino por los justos, sino para sanar y salvar a los pecadores. La misericordia de Dios es mayor que nuestra indignidad. Cuando reconocemos verdaderamente que Dios habita en nosotros, somos llamados a responder con fe y gratitud. Somos invitados a confiar en su misericordia y a vivir de manera que honremos nuestro cuerpo como morada sagrada de su presencia. Nuestra vida se convierte entonces en un testimonio silencioso: Dios vive en mí, y yo vivo en Dios.

Vivir la Palabra

Con nosotros mismos: Reconocer la presencia de Dios en ti. Cuidar tu cuerpo y mantenerlo puro y digno como templo de Dios.

Con los demás: Dar gracias a Dios por su presencia en ellos. Vivir de tal manera que otros puedan reconocer a Dios viviendo en ti.

Con Dios: Agradecer al Señor por habitar en ti y por salvarte con su misericordia.

Oración: Señor Dios, gracias por habitar en mí para que yo habite en Ti. Ayúdame a reconocer y experimentar más profundamente tu presencia en mí cada día. Concédeme la gracia de cuidar mi cuerpo con pureza e integridad, para que siempre te agrade hacer de mí tu morada. Amén.

Sábado: Mejor Morir una Vez que Perderse para Siempre - Juan 11, 45-56

Muchos dicen: “Cuando me jubile tendré más tiempo para servir en la parroquia”, o “Algún día me involucraré más”. Pero el mañana pertenece solo a Dios. A nosotros se nos ha dado únicamente el hoy. No sabemos qué traerá el mañana. Si alguien nos preguntara: “¿Cuándo volverás a tu familia? ¿Cuándo perdonarás? ¿Cuándo te arrepentirás? ¿Cuándo crearás de verdad? ¿Cuándo servirás al Señor con todo tu corazón?”, la única respuesta honesta y fiel siempre es la misma: hoy, no mañana. Jesús nos recuerda que la vida es preciosa y urgente. Retrasar la conversión, el amor y la fe es arriesgar lo que verdaderamente importa. Por eso somos invitados a vivir nuestra fe y nuestro amor a Dios hoy, como si fuera el último día de nuestra vida. Esto no significa vivir con miedo, sino con propósito, sinceridad y confianza en la misericordia de Dios.

Vivir la Palabra

Con nosotros mismos: Vivir hoy la fe y el amor a Dios como si hoy fuera el último día.

Con los demás: Recordar que nadie llega al cielo solo; caminar con otros y acompañarlos en el camino de la fe.

Con Dios: Dar gracias a Cristo, que murió para que nosotros tengamos vida verdadera.

Oración: Padre celestial, enséñame a vivir este día como si fuera el último de mi vida. Ayúdame a vivir con sinceridad ante Ti y con verdad ante mí mismo. Concédeme la gracia de responder a tu llamado hoy, no mañana, porque mañana tendrá su propio llamado. Pongo este día en tus manos. Amén.
