## Lenten Journey with Father Timothy

This Lent, as we conclude our walk on this path together, I encourage you to keep a Bible close at hand, allowing God's Word to guide your daily reflection through each day's sharing. Let us continue to journey, pray, and grow closer to God—together.

**Palm Sunday: Stay Awake and Pray So That You May Not Fall into Temptation - Mark 14:26-42**

Prayer is the breath of the soul. A faith without prayer is like a plant without water. When faith dries up, the soul becomes a desert—lifeless and empty. Even Jesus Himself prayed to the Father. Prayer is the sacred time when we encounter God in spirit and truth. It is where our relationship with Him is renewed and strengthened. In the reading, the disciples fell asleep when Jesus ask them to stay awake. We, too, can become drowsy in faith, distracted by comfort, materialism, conflict, power, and the noise of the world around us. That is why Jesus urges us: “Stay awake and pray.” Only through faithful and persevering prayer can we remain alert, rooted in God, and strong against temptation in a world that so often drifts away from Him.

### Living the Word

With ourselves: Recognize the absolute necessity of prayer. Commit to praying each day.

With others: Pray for them—by phone, online, through messages or emails.

With God: Pray with the Psalms; offer thanks and praise to the Lord.

**Prayer:** Heavenly Father, prayer is the strength that helps me overcome evil, and the humility that opens my heart to Your love. Help me to remain awake and faithful in prayer, and teach me to pray always according to Your holy will. Amen.

**Monday of Holy Week: Rejoice, for I Will Live with the Risen Lord - John 12:1-11**

During Lent, we reflect on sin, suffering, death, and judgment. Yet through Lazarus, God gives us a joyful and hope-filled image of life beyond death. Lazarus' story reminds us that our God is not the God of the dead, but the God of the living. God Himself is Life, and wherever He is, life triumphs over death. Our faith is not centered on the tomb, but on the table of the Lord—on communion, relationship, and eternal life with Him. During Lent, when we venerate the cross, kiss the feet of Jesus, or bow before His suffering, we are invited to do the same. We are called to love Jesus not just with external gestures, but with our whole heart and soul—with sincere repentance, gratitude, and trust.

### Living the Word

For ourselves: Believe firmly in the resurrection and rejoice, knowing that the Lord is alive and walks with us.

For others: Help those around us find joy and peace by encouraging them to trust in God.

For the Lord: Thank Jesus for His death and rejoice in His Resurrection, which brings us new life.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, help me to love You with the fragrance of my heart and with tears of sincere repentance. Teach me to love You truthfully, from deep within, not just through outward actions. Amen.

**Tuesday of Holy Week: “I Will Follow You” - John 13:31-38**

To follow Jesus does not mean that we are already holy, perfect, or exceptionally talented. In fact, the Gospel today reminds us that those who follow the Lord are often very human, fragile, and imperfect. Jesus knows Peter's weakness and still, He chooses him. Why? Because Peter's mission does not depend on his strength or ability, but on the power of the Holy Spirit. This is comforting for us. Many times, we hesitate to follow Jesus or to serve Him because we feel unworthy, weak, or inadequate. Yet Jesus calls us just as we are. We are invited to become Jesus' disciples, not by trusting in ourselves, but by relying on God's grace. The Lord can take what seems small, broken, or insufficient in us and make it fruitful for others—if we are humble enough to surrender ourselves to Him. When we acknowledge our limitations and place them in God's hands, His power and wisdom work through us.

### Living the Word

For ourselves: Be courageous and humble in serving the Lord. Trust not in your own strength, but in the power of God.

For others: Do not judge people by their weaknesses in ministry. If God chooses them, His grace will accompany them.

For the Lord: Thank Him for calling and using us, even in our weakness.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, I know that I am weak and lacking in faith. Yet I offer You my heart and my true self. Pour out Your Holy Spirit upon me and use me according to Your holy will. Amen.

**Wednesday of Holy Week: When I Am Judas - Matthew 26:20-25**

When we think of Judas, we immediately think of betrayal. We tell ourselves “I would never sell Jesus.” Yet if we look honestly at our own lives, we may discover moments when our words, choices, or silence resemble Judas more than we would like to admit. We become like Judas when we are ashamed to pray in public, when we are afraid to make the sign of the cross before meals, when we hesitate to identify ourselves as Christians, or when we remain distant and uninvolved in the life of our parish. We are Judas, too, when we participate in actions that contradict our faith—when we support practices such as abortion, or when we remain silent in the face of injustice and untruth. Holy Week is meant to awaken us. It is a sacred time to recognize our failures, to turn back to God, and to trust that His mercy is greater than our sin.

### Living the Word

For ourselves: Humbly examine our lives and recognize the ways we may have betrayed the Lord, and ask for God's forgiveness.

For others: Pray for those who oppose the Church, who do not believe in God, or who speak against the Blessed Virgin Mary.

For the Lord: Place our trust in His infinite mercy.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, at times in my life I have betrayed You in many ways. I sincerely repent of my sins and ask You to give me strength and wisdom, so that from this day forward I may not fall again. Amen

#### Holy Thursday: Wash One Another's Feet - John 13:1-11

Our feet are the part of the body that easily become dirty and need to be washed often. In the same way, our spiritual feet—our hearts and our relationships—can also become dirty when we trample on the dignity, honor, or integrity of others. Sometimes this happens in quiet but painful ways: when employers take advantage of their workers, when people use power to control rather than to serve, when words or actions wound instead of heal. These moments stain our hearts and distance us from one another. During the Last Supper, Jesus washes the feet of His disciples. This simple yet profound gesture is a lesson in humility and love. That same night, Jesus institutes the Eucharist. In the Upper Room, He gives Himself completely to humanity. Jesus' command is clear and demanding: "Love one another as I have loved you." As Christians, we are called to make Christ's love visible in our families, workplaces, schools, and parishes. Positions and titles are not meant to create divisions. They exist to serve, to build up the community, and to foster unity among all members of the Body of Christ.

#### Living the Word

For ourselves: Live humility in whatever role or responsibility we have. Do not seek honor or recognition.

For others: Show love not just in words, but through concrete actions of service and care.

For the Lord: Learn from and imitate Jesus' loving service to His disciples.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, help me to live and act with humility and love, following Your example. Teach me to accept one another's differences, and to always recognize You in my brothers and sisters. Amen.

#### Good Friday: Be Healed - Isaiah 53:4-10

As human beings, all of us carry wounds—some visible in our bodies, others hidden deep in our hearts. Doctors and mental health professionals can help us heal, and we are grateful for their care. Priests, as ministers of Christ, can also be called spiritual physicians. Yet all human healing has its limits. Only Jesus is the Divine Physician who can heal completely. His healing flows from love—love that is willing to suffer and to give itself fully. Through His suffering and death, humanity was healed from sin. On Good Friday, we are invited to stand at the foot of the Cross and recognize that "by His wounds we are healed." Jesus does not turn away from our suffering; He enters into it, transforms it, and redeems it. Today, the Church gently reminds us that healing of the soul is important. Our bodies will one day return to dust, but our souls are eternal. When our souls are healed and reconciled with God, everything else finds its proper place.

#### Living the Word

For ourselves: Seek healing for both body and soul. Be faithful in prayer and in participating in the Mass and the sacraments.

For others: Pray for those who are sick, suffering, or wounded in body and spirit.

For the Lord: Trust that Jesus is alive and continues to heal even today.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, through Your wounds and Your death, my soul has been healed. Help me to cherish and faithfully receive the healing medicine of the Holy Eucharist, so that I may be healed each moment of my life.

#### Holy Saturday: New Life in Christ - Romans 6:3-11

On this holy night, we stand on the threshold of Easter, preparing to welcome the Risen Lord. The Resurrection of Jesus is the greatest hope of our lives. It proclaims that death does not have the final word, and that love is stronger than sin and despair. Each of us is invited to enter fully into this new, risen life with Christ. New life in Christ is not merely a beautiful idea—it is a real way of living. It is a life no longer ruled by fear, hatred, selfish desires, or hopelessness. Faith in the Resurrection is, at its heart, faith in a God who never abandons those who trust in Him and never allows them to be lost. Yet we also know from experience that life is not easy. Who among us has not known fatigue, sorrow, or disappointment? Who has not felt wounded or overwhelmed at times? These struggles are real. But we are not meant to remain forever in the darkness of Good Friday. We are called to move forward into the joy of Easter Sunday. Christ is risen! But what does that mean for us if the Resurrection remains only a story from the past? What good is the Good News if it has not yet touched our hearts? The Resurrection becomes real and life-changing only when we allow the Risen Christ to dwell within us. Otherwise, darkness continues to linger, and the power of death still seems to rule. Holy Saturday invites us to ask ourselves: Have I prepared a place in my heart for the Risen Lord? Am I ready to let Him transform my life from within?

#### Living the Word

For ourselves: Rejoice and enthusiastically proclaim the Good News. Live as a witness to the Risen Christ.

For others: Build renewed and deeper relationships marked by forgiveness and love.

For the Lord: Praise and glorify Him. Long to be filled with the Holy Spirit.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus, the journey of Lent has come to an end. Through Your saving Blood, I have been cleansed, and I long to be reborn in the Holy Spirit. I rejoice because I will live with You forever. Alleluia.

#### **Camino Cuaresmal con el Padre Timothy**

En esta Cuaresma, mientras recorremos juntos este camino, los animo a mantener la Biblia siempre a mano, permitiendo que la Palabra de Dios guíe su reflexión diaria a través de cada compartir. Caminemos, oremos y crezcamos más cerca de Dios juntos.

#### **Domingo de Ramos: Permanezcan despiertos y oren para no caer en la tentación - Marcos 14, 26-42**

La oración es el aliento del alma. Una fe sin oración es como una planta sin agua. Cuando la fe se seca, el alma se convierte en un desierto—sin vida y vacío. Incluso Jesús mismo oraba al Padre. La oración es el tiempo sagrado en el que nos encontramos con Dios en espíritu y en verdad; es donde nuestra relación con Él se renueva y se fortalece. En la lectura, los discípulos se quedaron dormidos cuando Jesús les pidió que permanecieran despiertos. También nosotros podemos adormecernos en la fe, distraídos por la comodidad, el materialismo, los conflictos, el poder y el ruido del mundo que nos rodea. Por eso Jesús nos exhorta: "Permanezcan despiertos y oren". Solo mediante una oración fiel y perseverante podemos mantenernos alertas, arraigados en Dios y fuertes contra la tentación en un mundo que con frecuencia se aleja de Él.

#### **Vivir la Palabra**

Con nosotros mismos: Reconocer la necesidad absoluta de la oración. Comprometernos a orar cada día.

Con los demás: Orar por ellos—por teléfono, en línea, mediante mensajes o correos electrónicos.

Con Dios: Orar con los Salmos; ofrecer acción de gracias y alabanza al Señor.

**Oración:** Padre celestial, la oración es la fuerza que me ayuda a vencer el mal y la humildad que abre mi corazón a tu amor. Ayúdame a permanecer despierto y fiel en la oración, y enséñame a orar siempre conforme a tu santa voluntad. Amén.

### Lunes de Semana Santa: Alégrese, porque viviré con el Señor Resucitado - Juan 12, 1-11

Durante la Cuaresma reflexionamos sobre el pecado, el sufrimiento, la muerte y el juicio. Sin embargo, a través de Lázaro, Dios nos ofrece una imagen gozosa y llena de esperanza de la vida más allá de la muerte. La historia de Lázaro nos recuerda que nuestro Dios no es Dios de muertos, sino de vivos. Dios mismo es Vida, y donde Él está, la vida triunfa sobre la muerte. Nuestra fe no se centra en el sepulcro, sino en la mesa del Señor—en la comunión, la relación y la vida eterna con Él. Durante la Cuaresma, cuando veneramos la cruz, besamos los pies de Jesús o nos inclinamos ante su sufrimiento, somos invitados a hacer lo mismo: amar a Jesús no solo con gestos externos, sino con todo el corazón y el alma—con un arrepentimiento sincero, gratitud y confianza.

#### Vivir la Palabra

Para nosotros: Creer firmemente en la resurrección y alegrarnos, sabiendo que el Señor está vivo y camina con nosotros.

Para los demás: Ayudar a quienes nos rodean a encontrar alegría y paz, animándolos a confiar en Dios.

Para el Señor: Agradecer a Jesús por su muerte y alegrarnos en su Resurrección, que nos trae vida nueva.

**Oración:** Señor Jesús, ayúdame a amarte con la fragancia de mi corazón y con lágrimas de sincero arrepentimiento. Enséñame a amarte de verdad, desde lo más profundo de mi ser, y no solo con acciones externas. Amén.

### Martes de Semana Santa: “Te seguiré” - Juan 13, 31-38

Seguir a Jesús no significa que ya seamos santos, perfectos o excepcionalmente talentosos. De hecho, el Evangelio de hoy nos recuerda que quienes siguen al Señor suelen ser muy humanos, frágiles e imperfectos. Jesús conoce la debilidad de Pedro y, aun así, lo elige. ¿Por qué? Porque la misión de Pedro no depende de su fuerza o capacidad, sino del poder del Espíritu Santo. Esto nos consuela. Muchas veces dudamos en seguir a Jesús o en servirle porque nos sentimos indignos, débiles o incapaces. Sin embargo, Jesús nos llama tal como somos. Estamos invitados a ser discípulos de Jesús no confiando en nosotros mismos, sino apoyándonos en la gracia de Dios. El Señor puede tomar lo que parece pequeño, roto o insuficiente en nosotros y hacerlo fecundo para los demás—si somos lo suficientemente humildes para entregarnos a Él. Cuando reconocemos nuestras limitaciones y las ponemos en manos de Dios, su poder y sabiduría actúan a través de nosotros.

#### Vivir la Palabra

Para nosotros: Ser valientes y humildes al servir al Señor. No confiar en nuestras propias fuerzas, sino en el poder de Dios.

Para los demás: No juzgar a las personas por sus debilidades en el ministerio. Si Dios las elige, su gracia las acompañará.

Para el Señor: Darle gracias por llamarnos y utilizarnos, incluso en nuestra debilidad.

**Oración:** Señor Jesús, sé que soy débil y que me falta fe. Sin embargo, te ofrezco mi corazón y mi verdadero ser. Derrama tu Espíritu Santo sobre mí y úsame según tu santa voluntad. Amén.

### Miércoles de Semana Santa: Cuando yo soy Judas - Mateo 26, 20-25

Cuando pensamos en Judas, inmediatamente pensamos en la traición. Nos decimos: “Yo nunca vendería a Jesús”. Sin embargo, si miramos honestamente nuestra propia vida, podemos descubrir momentos en los que nuestras palabras, decisiones o silencios se parecen más a Judas de lo que nos gustaría admitir. Nos parecemos a Judas cuando nos avergonzamos de orar en público, cuando tenemos miedo de hacer la señal de la cruz antes de comer, cuando dudamos en identificarnos como cristianos o cuando permanecemos distantes y poco comprometidos con la vida de nuestra parroquia. También somos Judas cuando participamos en acciones que contradicen nuestra fe—cuando apoyamos prácticas como el aborto o cuando guardamos silencio ante la injusticia y la mentira. La Semana Santa está destinada a despertarnos. Es un tiempo sagrado para reconocer nuestros fallos, volver a Dios y confiar en que su misericordia es más grande que nuestro pecado.

#### Vivir la Palabra

Para nosotros: Examinar humildemente nuestra vida, reconocer las maneras en que hemos traicionado al Señor y pedir el perdón de Dios.

Para los demás: Orar por quienes se oponen a la Iglesia, por quienes no creen en Dios o hablan contra la Santísima Virgen María.

Para el Señor: Poner nuestra confianza en su infinita misericordia.

**Oración:** Señor Jesús, en algunos momentos de mi vida te he traicionado de muchas maneras. Me arrepiento sinceramente de mis pecados y te pido que me concedas fuerza y sabiduría, para que desde hoy en adelante no vuelva a caer. Amén.

### Jueves Santo: Lávense los pies unos a otros - Juan 13, 1-11

Nuestros pies son la parte del cuerpo que con mayor facilidad se ensucia y necesita ser lavada con frecuencia. De la misma manera, nuestros pies espirituales—nuestro corazón y nuestras relaciones—también pueden ensuciarse cuando pisoteamos la dignidad, el honor o la integridad de los demás. A veces esto sucede de maneras silenciosas pero dolorosas: cuando los empleadores se aprovechan de sus trabajadores, cuando las personas usan el poder para dominar en lugar de servir, cuando las palabras o las acciones hieren en vez de sanar. Estos momentos manchan nuestro corazón y nos alejan unos de otros. Durante la Última Cena, Jesús lava los pies de sus discípulos. Este gesto sencillo pero profundo es una lección de humildad y amor. Esa misma noche, Jesús instituye la Eucaristía. En el Cenáculo, Él se entrega completamente a la humanidad. El mandamiento de Jesús es claro y exigente: «Ámense unos a otros como yo los he amado». Como cristianos, estamos llamados a hacer visible el amor de Cristo en nuestras familias, lugares de trabajo, escuelas y parroquias. Los cargos y títulos no existen para crear divisiones; existen para servir, edificar la comunidad y fomentar la unidad entre todos los miembros del Cuerpo de Cristo.

#### Vivir la Palabra

Para nosotros: Vivir la humildad en cualquier función o responsabilidad que tengamos. No buscar honores ni reconocimiento.

Para los demás: Mostrar amor no solo con palabras, sino con acciones concretas de servicio y cuidado.

Para el Señor: Aprender e imitar el servicio amoroso de Jesús a sus discípulos.

**Oración:** Señor Jesús, ayúdame a vivir y actuar con humildad y amor, siguiendo tu ejemplo. Enséñame a acoger las diferencias de los demás y a reconocerte siempre en mis hermanos y hermanas. Amén.

**Viernes Santo: Sean sanados - Isaías 53, 4-10**

Como seres humanos, todos llevamos heridas—algunas visibles en nuestro cuerpo, otras ocultas en lo profundo del corazón. Los médicos y los profesionales de la salud mental pueden ayudarnos a sanar, y estamos agradecidos por su cuidado. Los sacerdotes, como ministros de Cristo, también pueden ser llamados médicos espirituales. Sin embargo, toda sanación humana tiene sus límites. Solo Jesús es el Médico Divino que puede sanar plenamente. Su sanación brota del amor—un amor dispuesto a sufrir y a entregarse totalmente. Por medio de su sufrimiento y su muerte, la humanidad fue sanada del pecado. En el Viernes Santo, somos invitados a permanecer al pie de la Cruz y a reconocer que «por sus llagas hemos sido curados». Jesús no se aparta de nuestro sufrimiento; entra en él, lo transforma y lo redime. Hoy, la Iglesia nos recuerda con ternura que la sanación del alma es esencial. Nuestros cuerpos un día volverán al polvo, pero nuestras almas son eternas. Cuando nuestras almas son sanadas y reconciliadas con Dios, todo lo demás encuentra su justo lugar.

**Vivir la Palabra**

Para nosotros: Buscar la sanación del cuerpo y del alma. Ser fieles a la oración y a la participación en la Misa y los sacramentos.

Para los demás: Orar por quienes están enfermos, sufren o están heridos en el cuerpo y en el espíritu.

Para el Señor: Confiar en que Jesús está vivo y continúa sanando incluso hoy.

**Oración:** Señor Jesús, por tus llagas y por tu muerte, mi alma ha sido sanada. Ayúdame a valorar y a recibir fielmente el medicamento sanador de la Sagrada Eucaristía, para que sea sanado en cada momento de mi vida.

**Sábado Santo: Vida nueva en Cristo - Romanos 6, 3-11**

En esta noche santa, nos encontramos al umbral de la Pascua, preparándonos para acoger al Señor Resucitado. La Resurrección de Jesús es la mayor esperanza de nuestra vida. Proclama que la muerte no tiene la última palabra y que el amor es más fuerte que el pecado y la desesperación. Cada uno de nosotros está invitado a entrar plenamente en esta vida nueva y resucitada con Cristo.

La vida nueva en Cristo no es solo una idea hermosa; es una manera real de vivir. Es una vida que ya no está dominada por el miedo, el odio, los deseos egoístas ni la desesperanza. La fe en la Resurrección es, en su esencia, fe en un Dios que nunca abandona a quienes confían en Él y que nunca permite que se pierdan. Sin embargo, también sabemos por experiencia que la vida no es fácil. ¿Quién de nosotros no ha conocido el cansancio, la tristeza o la decepción? ¿Quién no se ha sentido herido o abrumado en algún momento? Estas luchas son reales. Pero no estamos llamados a permanecer para siempre en la oscuridad del Viernes Santo. Estamos llamados a avanzar hacia la alegría del Domingo de Pascua. ¡Cristo ha resucitado! Pero ¿qué significa eso para nosotros si la Resurrección queda solo como una historia del pasado? ¿De qué sirve la Buena Nueva si aún no ha tocado nuestro corazón? La Resurrección se vuelve real y transformadora solo cuando permitimos que Cristo Resucitado habite en nosotros. De lo contrario, la oscuridad sigue presente y el poder de la muerte parece seguir dominando. El Sábado Santo nos invita a preguntarnos: ¿He preparado un lugar en mi corazón para el Señor Resucitado? ¿Estoy dispuesto a dejar que transforme mi vida desde dentro?

**Vivir la Palabra**

Para nosotros: Alegrarnos y proclamar con entusiasmo la Buena Nueva. Vivir como testigos de Cristo Resucitado.

Para los demás: Construir relaciones renovadas y más profundas, marcadas por el perdón y el amor.

Para el Señor: Alabar y glorificarlo. Anhelar ser llenos del Espíritu Santo.

**Oración:** Señor Jesús, el camino de la Cuaresma ha llegado a su fin. Por tu Sangre salvadora he sido purificado, y anhelo renacer en el Espíritu Santo. Me alegro porque viviré contigo para siempre. Aleluya.

## Why should you register?

By registering in a parish, you show your desire to be a part of our Catholic faith community. Registering is important. Census numbers (numbers of registered parishioners) help determine the number and forms of Masses and programs, the number of priests assigned, obligations to the Diocese, and other decisions about how best to support parish life.

This time of year, we are getting many requests for a signature from our Pastor on a form in order for you to be a godparent for someone else's child, or a sponsor for someone who is being confirmed. In order for us to be diligent in signing these forms, we need to check our records as to your attendance and participation. Being registered and active is also necessary to receive a discounted price for Faith Formation or for weddings.

**THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT:** because our parish is so large, the only way for us to verify that you are attending Mass and an active member of the parish is for you to turn in your envelope with your parish registration number on it. It can be empty, \$1.00 or \$1,000,000—we just need to know that you are joining us.

What does committing to a parish mean?

Committing to a parish is much like a commitment to family, friend, school, or community group. The parish makes a commitment to be there for you the parish family to provide Masses, Sacraments, educational programs and ministries. When you join a parish, you make a commitment to be an active member, to contribute of your time, talent, treasure, and prayer to support the mission and work of the Church. If you attend Mass at St. Catherine of Alexandria and contribute on a regular basis but you are not registered, please register. We don't have the ability to account for non-registered members for your tax deduction letters and other purposes.

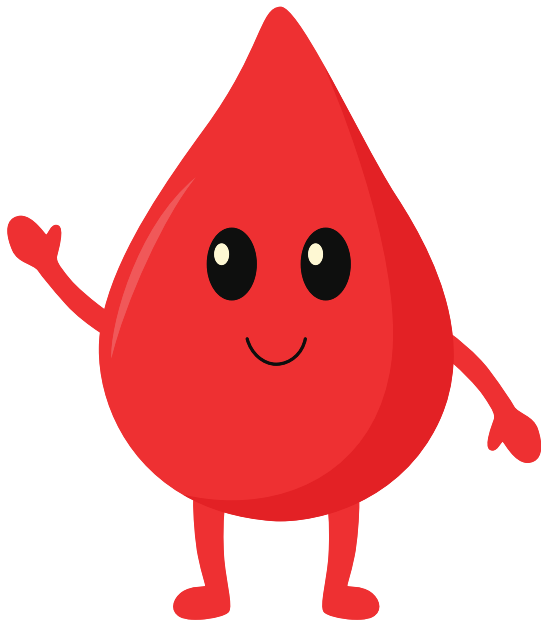

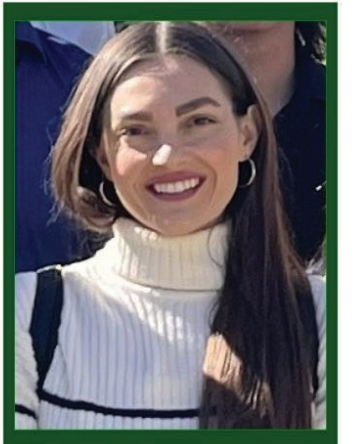
