Dear Brothers and Sisters,

After forty days of the quiet journey of Lent—marked by prayer, fasting, and the sincere conversion of our hearts—today we rejoice with the whole Church throughout the world as we celebrate the great feast of Easter, the mystery of new life and new hope in Jesus Christ.

With the joyful song of the Easter Vigil, we proclaim with glad hearts:

Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her,
ablaze with light from her eternal King,
let all corners of the earth be glad,
knowing an end to gloom and darkness.

Indeed, Jesus Christ—the Son of God made man—freely accepted suffering and the humiliation of death on the cross. Yet death could not hold Him. He rose again in glory to free humanity from the darkness of sin and death, opening for us the path that leads to light and eternal life.

The mystery of the Resurrection proclaims to us a truth filled with hope: suffering, evil, and even death are not the final word in human life. The stones of hatred, injustice, indifference, fear, and despair have been rolled away. The light of the Risen Christ shines into the darkest corners of our hearts and our world, so that new life, peace, and the love of God may grow there.

In the light of Easter, we firmly believe that Christ Himself is “our hope” (1 Tim 1:1). In Him we are saved and given life. As Saint Paul assures us: “There is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus” (Rom 8:1), and “just as all die in Adam, so all will be brought to life in Christ” (1 Cor 15:22).

Celebrating Easter is not only remembering an event in the past; it is welcoming a living grace that continues to work in our lives today. God continues to sustain and console us in the midst of every trial. He is never indifferent to human suffering. Instead, He has taken our wounds upon Himself in order to heal us. And we trust in the promise that “God works all things for the good of those who love Him” (Rom 8:28). If we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with Him (Rom 6:8).

So that the joy of Easter may not remain only within our liturgies but truly enter our daily lives, I would like to gently invite you to consider a couple of simple practices:

1. Renew the life of faith within your family.

Begin within your own home. Spend time praying together, learn to forgive one another, make small sacrifices for each other, and practice concrete acts of charity. In the family, faith, hope, and love are nurtured and allowed to grow.

2. Follow the example of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

May she teach us to live with humility, dedication, and generous service. Through her loving intercession, may every Catholic family become a living sign of unity and peace, filled with the grace of the Resurrection.

May the Risen Christ—who has conquered evil and death—heal the wounds in our hearts and bodies, bring peace to every family, and fill us with a joy that will never fade.

Wishing each of you a blessed Easter season filled with grace, joy, and hope.

Christ is risen! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Queridos hermanos y hermanas:

Después de cuarenta días del camino silencioso de la Cuaresma —marcado por la oración, el ayuno y la sincera conversión de nuestros corazones— hoy nos alegramos, junto con toda la Iglesia en el mundo, al celebrar la gran solemnidad de la Pascua, el misterio de la vida nueva y de la esperanza renovada en Jesucristo.

Con el canto gozoso de la Vigilia Pascual proclamamos, con corazones llenos de alegría:
Goce también la tierra, inundada de tanta claridad,
y que, radiante con el fulgor del Rey eterno,
se sienta libre de la tiniebla que cubría el orbe entero.

En verdad, Jesucristo —el Hijo de Dios hecho hombre— aceptó libremente el sufrimiento y la humillación de la muerte en la cruz. Pero la muerte no pudo retenerlo: Él resucitó gloriosamente para liberar a la humanidad de la oscuridad del pecado y de la muerte, abriéndonos el camino hacia la luz y la vida eterna.

El misterio de la Resurrección nos anuncia una verdad llena de esperanza: el sufrimiento, el mal y la muerte no tienen la última palabra en la vida humana. Las piedras del odio, la injusticia, la indiferencia, el miedo y la desesperanza han sido removidas. La luz de Cristo Resucitado ilumina los rincones más oscuros de nuestros corazones y de nuestro mundo, para que allí broten una vida nueva, la paz y el amor de Dios.

A la luz de la Pascua, creemos firmemente que Cristo es verdaderamente “nuestra esperanza” (1 Tim 1,1). En Él somos salvados y recibimos la vida. Como afirma san Pablo: “Ya no hay condenación para los que están en Cristo Jesús” (Rom 8,1), y “así como todos mueren en Adán, así también todos serán vivificados en Cristo” (1 Cor 15,22).

Celebrar la Pascua no es solamente recordar un acontecimiento del pasado, sino acoger una gracia viva que sigue actuando hoy en nuestras vidas. Dios continúa sosteniéndonos y consolándonos en medio de todas nuestras pruebas. Él no es indiferente al sufrimiento humano; al contrario, ha cargado con nuestras heridas para sanarnos. Y confiamos en la promesa de que “Dios hace que todo coopere para el bien de los que lo aman” (Rom 8,28). Si hemos muerto con Cristo, creemos que también viviremos con Él (Rom 6,8).

Para que la alegría de la Pascua no se quede solamente en la liturgia, sino que también se refleje en nuestra vida diaria, quisiera invitarlos a considerar algunas prácticas sencillas: Renovar la vida de fe en la familia. Comencemos en nuestro propio hogar: dediquemos tiempo a orar juntos, aprendamos a perdonarnos, hagamos pequeños sacrificios unos por otros y practiquemos obras concretas de caridad. Es en la familia donde la fe, la esperanza y el amor se alimentan y crecen.

Seguir el ejemplo de la Santísima Virgen María. Que ella nos enseñe a vivir con humildad, entrega y generosidad en el servicio. Por su intercesión amorosa, que cada familia católica llegue a ser un signo vivo de unidad y de paz, llena de la gracia de la Resurrección.

Que Cristo Resucitado —quien ha vencido el mal y la muerte— sane las heridas de nuestros corazones y de nuestros cuerpos, conceda paz a cada familia y haga brillar en nosotros una alegría que nunca se apague.

Les deseo a todos una bendita Pascua, llena de gracia, alegría y esperanza.

¡Cristo ha resucitado! ¡Aleluya! ¡Aleluya!

GOSPEL MEDITATION -
April 5, 2026
Easter Sunday
John 20:1-9

Zander Price was the fastest kid at my grade school. He won every race on Field Day. To me, his swiftness meant he was the greatest. Zander was the best.

It's the same with the speediest Apostle on Easter morning. John tells us he "ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first." (John 20:4) But only after Peter entered did John go in, see the burial cloths, and believe. Here is a symbol of two dimensions of the Church. John, the beloved disciple, represents the contemplative, mystical life: affection, prayer, intimacy. Peter, the rock, represents the Church's institutional life: steady, authoritative, structured...but slower.

Of course, John runs faster! Love is the heartbeat of Christian faith, so love will always arrive first. Peter's role is, in a sense, secondary. He arrives later, but is still very much needed. John waits for him. The Church must be built, balanced, protected, and led. Love without structure can vanish; structure without love becomes lifeless.

This dynamic is not just historical — it is personal. In you, there is a John who longs to run to the tomb in love. Let him run! Pray, sing, love Jesus. There is also a Peter, who eventually gets to the tomb and takes charge. The Risen Christ wants both. Remember: if you want to get to the mystery of Jesus' resurrection fast...love him, for love is best.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO -
 5 de abril de 2026
 Domingo de Pascua
 Juan 20:1-9

La experiencia de la Pascua de aquella mañana era, sin lugar a duda, clara y perfecta: se trataba de ver y creer. Al amanecer, muy tempranito, fue María Magdalena al sepulcro para buscar al Señor; sin embargo, ¡qué sorpresa tan grande! Estaba movida la piedra del sepulcro. De inmediato regresó para avisar a Pedro y a Juan, y les dijo: "Se han llevado del sepulcro al Señor, y no sabemos dónde lo han puesto" (Juan 20:2). ¡Qué tremenda sorpresa para ellos! Después de ver sufrir a Jesús en la cruz, ahora estaba desaparecido. Sin embargo, ese no era el plan trazado por Dios para comprender la resurrección de su Hijo. Los más cercanos a Jesús —los que habían caminado juntos, predicando, curando a los enfermos y haciendo milagros— ahora tenían que testificar que Jesús había resucitado, que estaba vivo y que era el mismo que había compartido el pan con ellos.

El Evangelio nos dice: "No habían entendido todavía la Escritura: él debía resucitar de entre los muertos" (Juan 20:9). ¡Cristo vive! En verdad ha resucitado: este es el grito de sus discípulos y de la creación entera, entonces y ahora. El gozo y la alegría deben brotar del corazón de cada cristiano. Alegrémonos con este gran regalo de la Pascua; seamos portadores de paz y no de miedo. Seamos heraldos de esperanza en medio de la hostilidad y el odio que tantas veces paralizan la gracia de Dios en el mundo.

Why should you register?

By registering in a parish, you show your desire to be a part of our Catholic faith community. Registering is important. Census numbers (numbers of registered parishioners) help determine the number and forms of Masses and programs, the number of priests assigned, obligations to the Diocese, and other decisions about how best to support parish life.

This time of year, we are getting many requests for a signature from our Pastor on a form in order for you to be a godparent for someone else's child, or a sponsor for someone who is being confirmed. In order for us to be diligent in signing these forms, we need to check our records as to your attendance and participation. Being registered and active is also necessary to receive a discounted price for Faith Formation or for weddings.

THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT: because our parish is so large, the only way for us to verify that you are attending Mass and an active member of the parish is for you to turn in your envelope with your parish registration number on it. It can be empty, \$1.00 or \$1,000,000—we just need to know that you are joining us.

What does committing to a parish mean?

Committing to a parish is much like a commitment to family, friend, school, or community group. The parish makes a commitment to be there for you the parish family to provide Masses, Sacraments, educational programs and ministries. When you join a parish, you make a commitment to be an active member, to contribute of your time, talent, treasure, and prayer to support the mission and work of the Church. If you attend Mass at St. Catherine of Alexandria and contribute on a regular basis but you are not registered, please register. We don't have the ability to account for non-registered members for your tax deduction letters and other purposes.

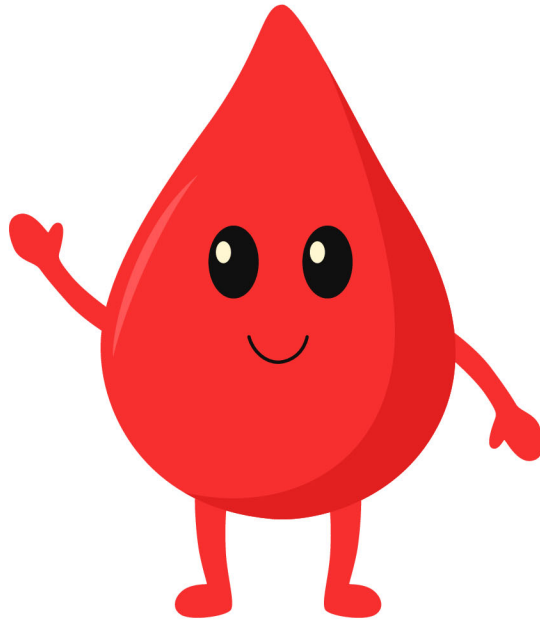

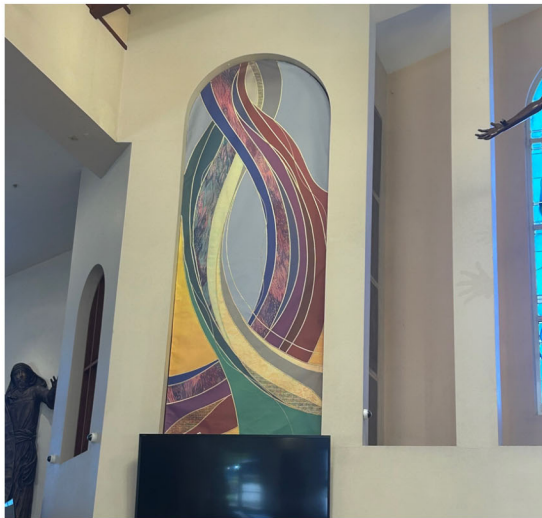
